Pre-screening of passengers	 Cruise Lines must put in place measures to detect asymptomatic passengers. This includes: Negative COVID-19 test result for all passengers prior to boarding Travel and Health declaration prior to arriving at the terminal Online check-in prior to arrival at terminal
Reduce crowding	Cruise Lines must put in place measures to limit crowding throughout the passenger journey. This includes: • Embarkation at terminal: Assign embarkation times and turn away guests outside of embarkation times to maintain capacity levels • Onboard: Review activities onboard and allow booking of facilities/ dining time • Debarkation: Assign debarkation times
Safe Management Measures (SMMs) in line with prevailing national policy at time of sailing	 Masks to be worn at all times 1m safe distance between passengers at all times On-board measures to discourage close contacts between groups Contactless temperature-taking to identify passengers with fever Adhere to SMMs for various settings and activities in line with national policy Terminal to abide by prevailing SMMs for venues under the COVID-19 (Temporary Measures) Act, e.g. temperature taking
Contact Tracing	 Mandatory usage of the TraceTogether Token or TraceTogether App outside of cabins Clear communications channel with ship if passengers/ crew develop COVID-19 related symptoms within 14 days post-sailing
